Forecast of Hazardous Tree Removal work tasks

- Slashing
- Girdling
- Lop and Scatter
- Selective Slashing/Thinning
- Pruning
- Pile and cover
- Slashing, Pile and Cover
- Fuel Modification Zone Construction, Timber Stands and Woodland/Shrub land
- Hand cutting and Mechanical Piling
- Fire line Construction and maintenance
- Fuels Pullback
- Related services for fuel treatments
- Air curtain burners
- Mechanical Severing and Piling
- Mechanical Fuels Treatment: Grinding, piling, crushing, chipping, chaining, dixie harrow, mowing, grubbing, root knife
- Thinning, pruning and piling
- Clear cut and scatter
- Partial cut and scatter
- Spot application of herbicide, Cut stump and basal bark application
- Broadcast ground application of herbicide

- Also professional felling

- Potentially whole tree chipping

- Pile burning operations will be done by Contractors but only under the supervision of a Forest Service Burn and Firing Boss
