The purpose of this pre-application is to secure funds for environmental studies on the **“Murphys to Forest Meadows Fuel Break”** that will deliver a CEQA compliant document.

Located on the south side of Highway 4 between Murphys and Forest Meadows, this ~578-acre proposed fuel break will enhance watershed and forest health and protect ~7,000 residences in a wildland urban interface (WUI) setting in southeast Calaveras County by:

- reducing the risk of fire ignition and spread
- substantially aiding in fire containment and control
- creating safety zones for fire fighters and citizens
- increasing forest resilience to drought and disease
- conserving water
- minimizing erosion
- protecting water quality
- avoiding the massive releases of greenhouse gases that occur during wildfires

This planned fuel break is part of a larger network of fuel breaks along the Ebbetts Pass Corridor (the Highway 4 Fuel Reduction Project, which runs on both sides of Highway 4 from Murphys to Big Trees Subdivision) being planned, coordinated and implemented by several agencies, including CAL FIRE, the US Forest Service, the Calaveras Foothill Firesafe Council, the Calaveras Amador Forestry Team, SPI, Homeowner Associations, private land owners, and the Amador-Calaveras Consensus Group.

Estimated costs for the planning activities were calculated assuming an average rate of \$125/acre for CEQA plus 15% for administration and 15% for management, for a total of \$93,925.

Why this project is a priority: This proposed fuel break is in the 50-mile long Ebbetts Pass Corridor, which has been designated by CAL FIRE as having a *Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zone* rating and has been categorized as having a *High Fire Hazard* rating by the United States Forest Service. Ebbetts Pass includes a spectrum of assets at risk to wild fire, including homes and businesses, watershed resources, major commercial timber holdings, water collection, treatment and distribution infrastructure, electrical power generation and distribution infrastructure, communications infrastructure, recreational resources, and historical and archeological sites.

When completed, this fuel break will directly protect the residents of Murphys, Forest Meadows, Hathaway Pines, and Avery, home to about 6,200 residents. More broadly, the Ebbetts Pass communities of Angels Camp and Vallecito, to the west, and Avery, Arnold and Dorrington to the east, as well as Calaveras Big Trees State Park, will benefit from the increased probability for successful fire suppression on the initial response.

The **Murphys to Forest Meadows Fuel Break** was originally planned in 2007 but never implemented. This Category 2 Planning grant would provide the funds for environmental analyses for this critical link in the fire protection system along Highway 4 and make it “shovel ready” as implementation funds become available.

Project acreage: The proposed project area covers about 578 acres. The planning activity would potentially break the project into phases that could be accomplished over the course of 2 or 3 years, depending on the amount of field work that can be accomplished during the wet season when the risk of fire ignition is low.

Planning Approach: This Category 2 Planning grant would provide the funds to make this critical fuel break ready for implementation when funding becomes available. The Category 2 funds would be used to:

- Plan and execute CEQA analysis and reports
- Communicate and work with private landowners to assure their buy-in and participation
- Develop plans for efficient implementation and ongoing maintenance and monitoring
- Conduct financial analysis to estimate costs and determine realistic time lines for implementation
- Develop treatment plans, both for implementation and maintenance phases
- Identify monitoring activities for out years

Timeframe: Planning activities, including CEQA, should be completed for a significant portion of the acreage within one year from award. CEQA compliance would be the most challenging activity and would be started immediately with the intent of significant progress when seeking funding for implementation for the 2019 CAL FIRE and SNC grant cycles (May – July).

Expected natural resource and community benefits: Although proposed *planning activities* will have no direct impact on natural resources, the project will contribute to healthier forest conditions along the entire 50-mile Ebbetts Pass Corridor and the Stanislaus National Forest.

- Fuel treatment projects **reduce wildfire risks** by breaking up fuel continuity and eliminating the fuel chain between structures and surrounding forest vegetation. Protection is two-directional -- homes and communities are protected from encroaching wildfires, and the forest is protected from fires originating within communities.
- The **Stanislaus River watershed will be protected** from the effects of intensive wildfires, which can include compromised water quality long after a fire has been contained. Burn areas are prone to greater

rates of erosion, increasing the downstream accumulation of sediment in streams, rivers and reservoirs, impacting water used for domestic and agricultural purposes. The Stanislaus River is one of the most heavily dammed and diverted rivers in California, with 28 major dams on the river and its tributaries, creating a combined storage capacity of more than 2.8 million acres feet of water. The river irrigates 213,000 acres of productive farmland. Fourteen hydroelectric plants are operated by various local irrigation districts, private power companies and federal agencies. The river provides domestic and industrial water supply to **downstream beneficiaries**, including the cities of Manteca, Lathrop, Escalon and Tracy. The Stanislaus is a vital resource to maintain fisheries, dilute pollution, recharge groundwater, and control saline intrusion in the Sacramento-San Joaquin River Delta. - **Climate change mitigation:** Wildfires emit large quantities of carbon dioxide, as well as other greenhouse gases and air pollutants such as methane and nitrous oxide. Up to 3% of annual U.S. greenhouse gas emissions come from wildfires. Burned trees continue to release carbon stores as they decompose after a fire, and carbon uptake is slowed or halted in burned areas because the vegetation is gone and photosynthesis cannot take place. (Source: [Wildfires and Climate Change](#)). The primary climate benefits of fuel breaks are through fire avoidance.
- **Wildlife habitat and species** will be protected from uncontrolled wild fires.
- The Ebbetts Pass Corridor is home to many **recreational opportunities**, including hiking, boating, skiing, tourism, camping, fishing, wineries, cycling, hunting, OHV riding, scenic driving, and winter sports. All are protected and enhanced by healthy forests and watersheds.

Describe specific potential future implementation project: The **Murphys to Forest Meadows Fuel Break** is a ~578-acre parcel of privately owned land that would protect the adjacent community of Forest Meadows as well as other communities and resources along the Ebbetts Pass Corridor. This fuel break is part of the Highway 4 Fuel Reduction Project, a network of fuel reduction projects -- planned, in progress, and existing -- that will ultimately protect all WUI communities along Highway 4. Projects are being planned and executed by a variety of agencies and private organizations, coordinated through CAL FIRE, the Ebbetts Pass Fire District, the Foothills Fire Safe Council, homeowners and private subdivisions.

Description of project location: Located in Calaveras County, along Highway 4/Ebbetts Pass. The planned fuel break runs between Murphys and Forest Meadows on the south side of Highway 4.

Nearby communities and public lands: Many communities and public assets would be protected by this fuel break, including:

- Murphys (population 2,343) is a focal point for tourism, with wineries, restaurants, vacation rentals, and historic sites, all of which are at risk. Murphys' community resources include a library, community park, and senior center. Tourists often frequent neighboring towns and attractions, including Calaveras Big Trees State Park, Columbia State Park, Bear Valley Ski Area, and the towns of Angels Camp and Arnold.
- Economies of all towns along Highway 4 would be negatively impacted if a severe wildfire were to breach this planned fuel break. In addition to the town of Murphys, several other communities along Highway 4 would be protected by this fuel break, including Douglas Flat, Forest Meadows, Red Apple, Rocky Hill, Indian Creek, Vallecito, Angels Camp, Avery, Timber Trails, and Arnold.
- Public lands and facilities that would be protected include the Stanislaus National Forest, the Stanislaus River, New Melones Lake, Natural Bridges Recreation Area, Moaning Caverns Adventure Park, Ironstone Amphitheater, Bear Valley Ski Area, the Arnold Rim Trail, and Calaveras Big Trees State Park.

Watershed: The **Murphys to Forest Meadows Fuel Break** is located in the upper Stanislaus Watershed. The Stanislaus River watershed drains 1,075 square miles. The upper watershed comprises 90 percent of the total area and supplies a commensurate proportion of the river flow. Stretching from the foothill to alpine regions of the Sierra Nevada, it consists of rugged narrow canyons and ridges. Most of the upper basin is either undeveloped or commercial timber land, with very small areas of agriculture, ranching, and mountain meadows above the tree line. The higher elevations are mostly federal Forest Service land and designated wilderness, while the middle elevations are a patchwork of state, federal and privately-owned land

Downstream Beneficiaries of the Proposed Project: The lower Stanislaus River watershed comprises only about one-tenth of the total area and is used mainly for agriculture (61 percent) and urban development (34 percent), with minimal open space. Major communities near the lower river include (from upstream to downstream) Copperopolis, Knights Ferry, East Oakdale, Oakdale, Riverbank, Escalon, Salida and Ripon.

The Stanislaus River is one of the most heavily dammed and diverted rivers in California, relative to its size. There are 28 major dams on the Stanislaus River and its tributaries with a combined storage capacity of more than 2.8 million acre feet. The river irrigates some 213,000 acres of productive farmland, most of it in Stanislaus and San Joaquin Counties. Fourteen hydroelectric plants on the river and its tributaries are operated by various local irrigation districts, private power companies and federal agencies. The river provides domestic and industrial water supply to nearby cities, including Manteca, Lathrop, Escalon and Tracy. Stanislaus River water flows are also a vital resource to maintain fisheries and recreational activities, dilute pollution, recharge groundwater, and control saline intrusion in the Sacramento–San Joaquin River Delta.

The closest community, Forest Meadows, is supportive. They have spent HOA funds on a CWPP and CEQA (2007) and have offered to work with landowners in Forest Meadows to get ROEs and cooperation.

There is no known opposition to the project.

Land Ownership and Restrictions on Land Use

The ROE forms we develop for this project will detail and approve requirements for the planning/CEQA work as well as the implementation work; they will include information about out-years requirements for maintenance and SNC access.

Environmental Compliance

SNC requires that all projects comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) at the time the SNC Governing Board authorizes a grant. Since the complexity of CEQA compliance will vary depending on project activities, it is important to consult with SNC staff as

A project will only be eligible to submit a Full Application if SNC determines there is a reasonable expectation that CEQA compliance will be completed in sufficient time for Board consideration. In addition to CEQA, projects subject to National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) must be NEPA compliant.

The last CEQA survey (2007) resulted in a Negative Declaration, and we expect that the result will be the same in 2018. The proposed site of the Fuel Break is about 95% on land with <30% slope and appears to be a good candidate for mastication with only small pockets needing hand crews to work steeper slopes. The area has several roads that will make access fairly easy, which may keep the cost of doing CEQA inspections and the implementation of the final project in check.

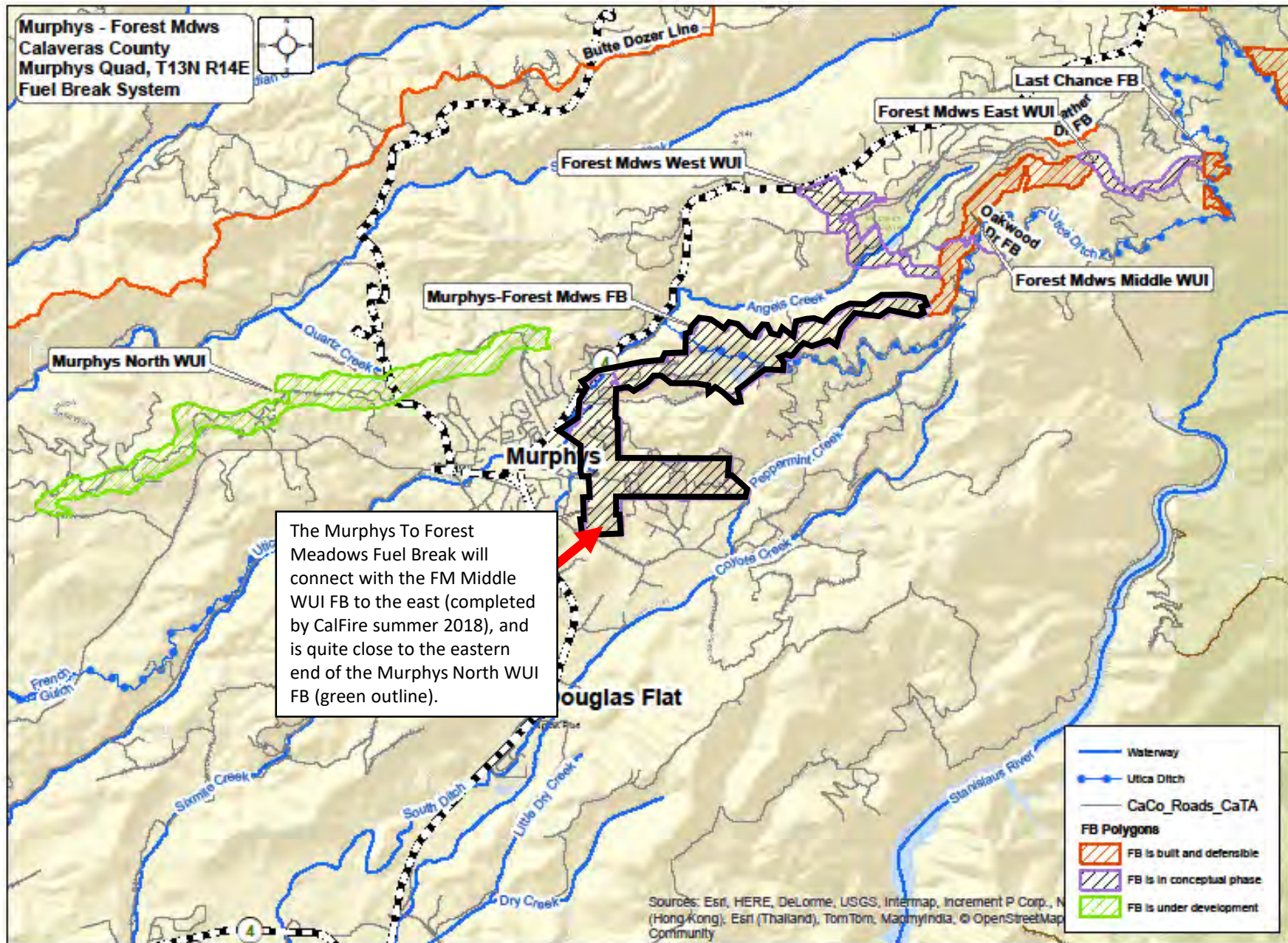
Considerations for a Future Full Application

- Under Proposition 1 and Proposition 68, applicants for Category One implementation projects are required to consult with the California Conservation Corps (CCC) and California Association of Local Conservation Corps (CALCC) to determine if it is feasible for the Corps to play a role in the project. Projects that only include planning or property acquisition are exempt from this requirement. The Corps have an email consultation process in place that takes five business days to complete. Please see the [CCC website](#) and [CALCC website](#) for more information about the process, or contact the CCC and CALCC at Prop1@ccc.ca.gov and inquiry@prop1communitycorps.org. Applicants will be required to submit the email consultation as part of the Full Application.
- SNC strongly encourages Native American engagement with projects. In the Full Application, all applicants will be required to demonstrate that appropriate Tribal representatives were notified of the project. SNC can assist applicants with identifying Native American Tribes whose ancestral homelands may be in the project areas and contact information for those Tribes.
- The Full Application will require letters of support from all landowners as well as a draft copy of the proposed land tenure agreement for Category One projects. If the project is awarded, a signed formal land tenure agreement with all landowners giving permission for the project must be submitted before the grant agreement can be executed. SNC can provide sample land tenure agreements for private and public properties.
- The Lead Agency responsible for CEQA compliance must be identified in the Full Application with documentation from that Agency confirming intent to serve as Lead. Applicants may request that SNC serve as Lead Agency if there is no other organization with standing to serve as Lead. This request **must** come during the Pre-Application process. The project will only be eligible to submit a Full Application if SNC determines there is a reasonable expectation that CEQA compliance will be completed in sufficient time for Board consideration.
- The full application will require a description of the long-term management and sustainability of the project. Category One projects must be maintained for a minimum of ten years, and SNC must have permission to monitor the project site for 25 years.
- SNC will establish a GIS record of the project location. SNC staff will work with applicants to develop or transfer GIS files.

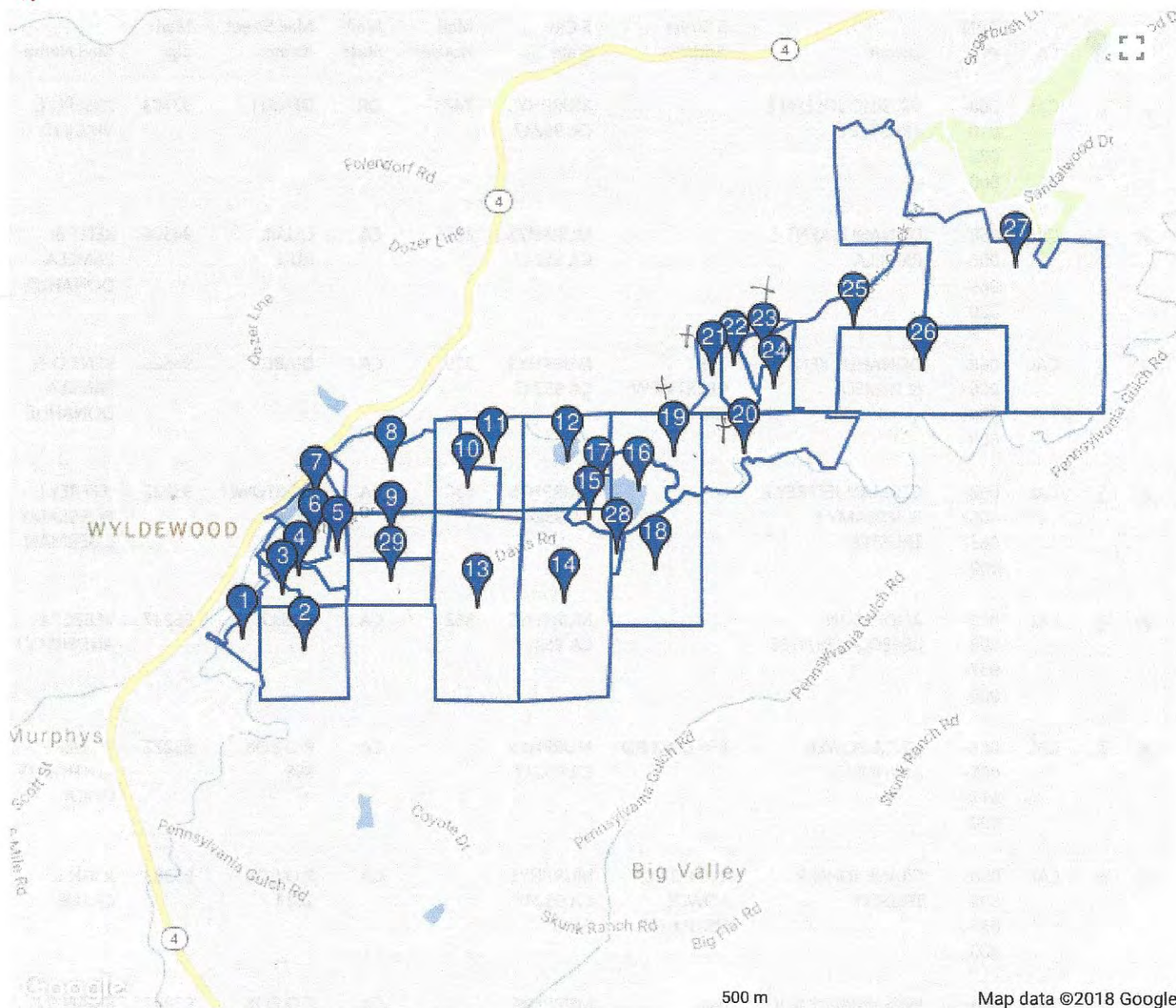

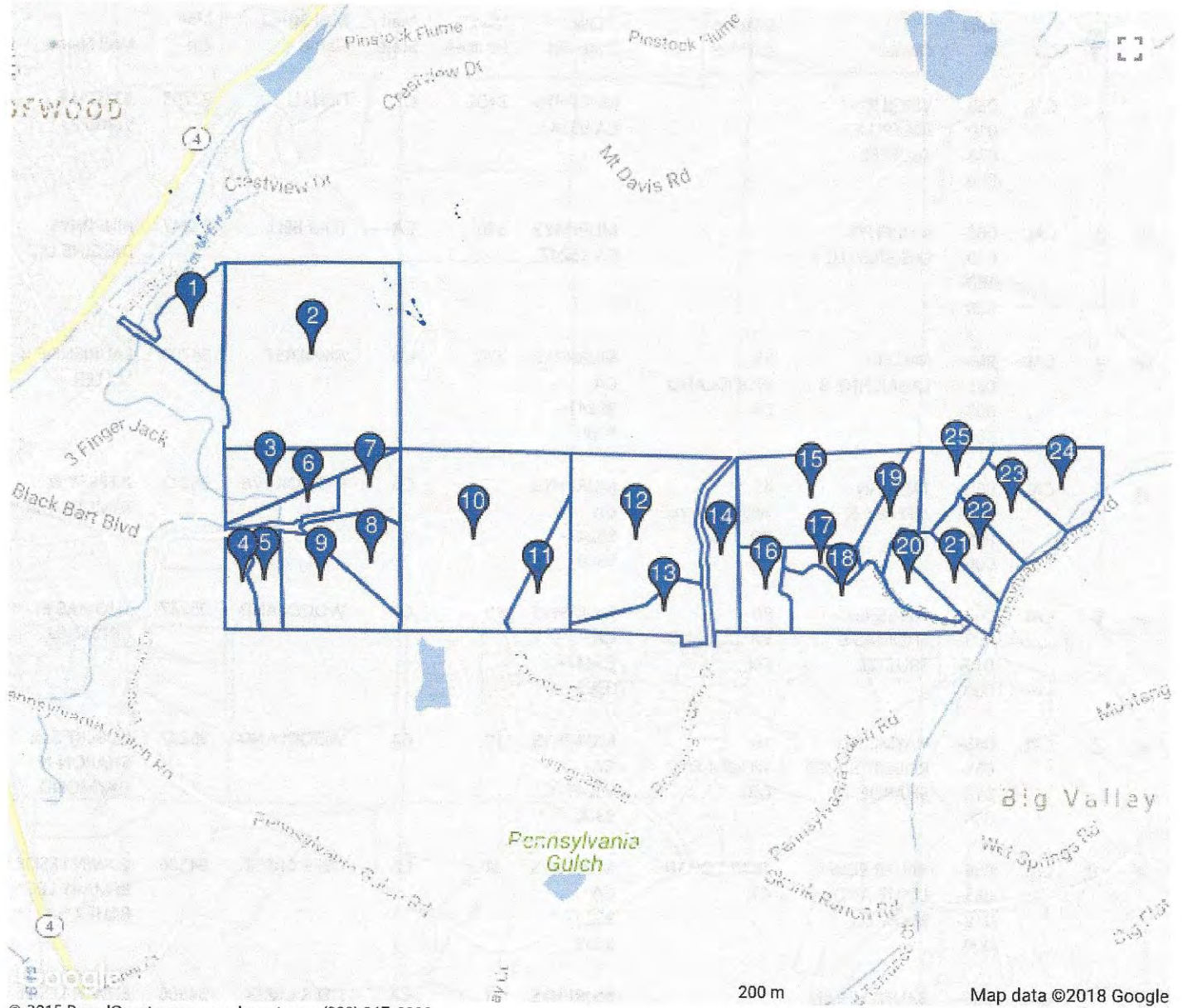

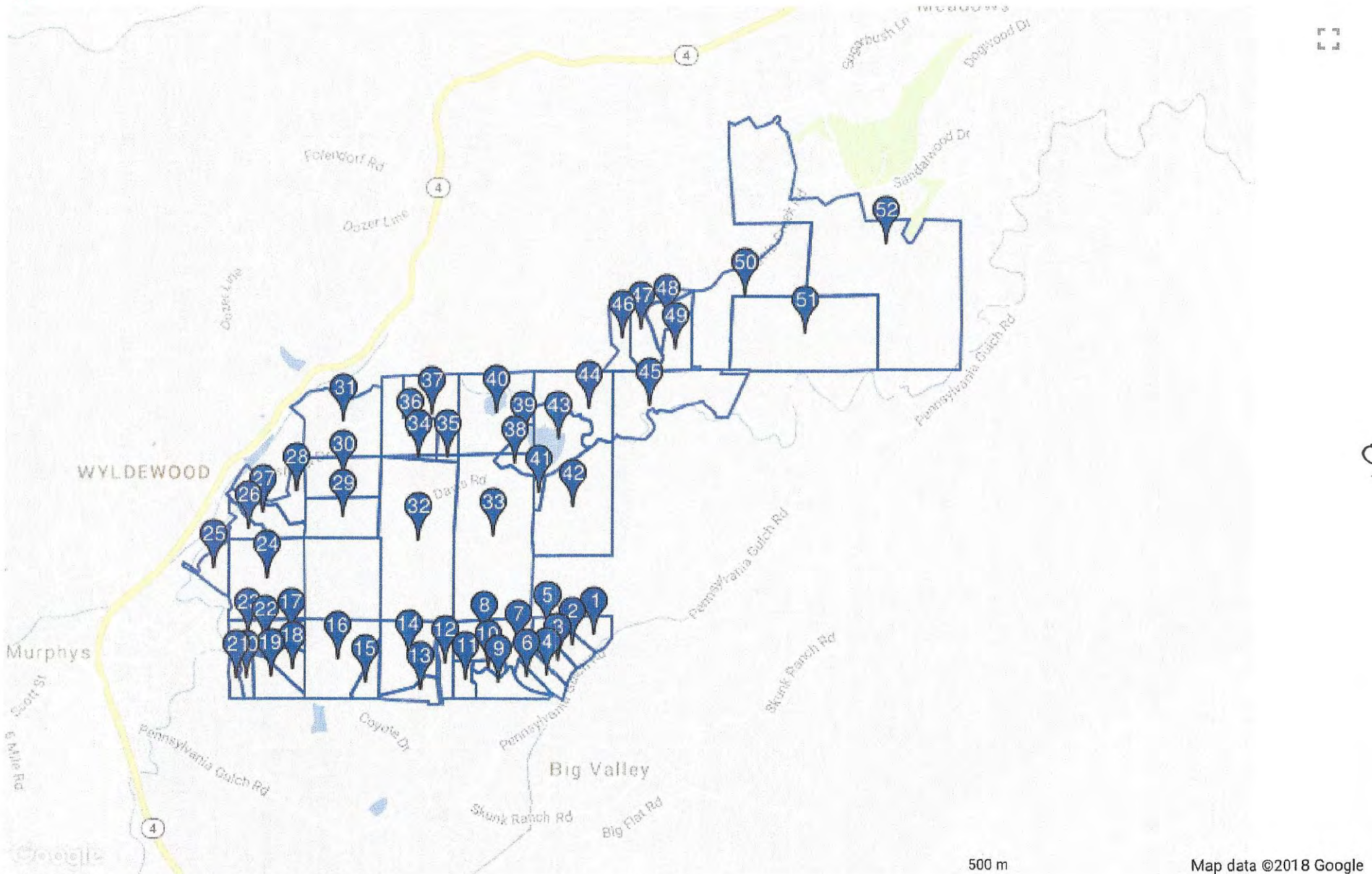
