

Total Miles of Roads = 2057






# Hazard Tree Guidelines For Forest Service Facilities and Roads in the Pacific Southwest Region

These hazard tree guidelines provide a means to identify and abate hazard from trees that are likely to fail and cause injury to either people or property on Forest Service system roads or at Forest Service facilities (i.e. campgrounds, boat ramps, trailhead parking, summer home tracts, administrative sites, kiosks, information centers, etc.) in California. They are intended to provide consistent direction for hazard tree identification and abatement and their use is highly encouraged and fully supported by Forest Health Protection (FHP) staff.

Environmental Analysis Using a Categorical Exclusion 36 CFR 220.6(d)(4). Repair and maintenance of roads, trails and boundaries....

- **Specialists to do environmental analyses on the following:**
  - Federally listed threatened or endangered species.....
  - Flood plains, wetlands or municipal watersheds
  - Congressionally designated areas (eg wilderness areas)
  - Roadless areas
  - Research Natural Areas
  - American Indians.....or cultural sites
  - Archeological Sites
  - Other laws that need documented compliance

# “Design Features”


- Where there may be threatened and endangered species:
  - Option 1: fell the hazard trees but do not extract the logs (flag and avoid)
  - Option 2: fell the trees, but only when the species are not mating;


Where there may be a streambed:

Option 1: fell the hazard trees but do not extract the logs


Where there may be an archeological site:

Option 1: fell the hazard trees directionally and away from the arch site.


