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8	Planning Work Group updates:		
8	 Power Fire Culvert Replacement (Hopson) – will broaden topic next agenda; there are concerns about the marking of hazard trees in Amador Ranger District; decided to set up a training workshop. Agend will come out this week; meeting will be short; will involve Phil Cannon, Pete Angwin, Martin MacKenzie, others. Rick encourages people to attend; Meeting will be Wednesday 10/24, 9:00 AM at the Amador Ranger District Office. Please send Rick specific locations to look at. The project was developed from Tom Black's GRAIP studies. Doing lots of contracts now out of GRA work; doing NEPA; 3-4 months before done; replacing with bigger culverts. Rich Farrington noted a paper on this topic that addresses 92 culverts (http://acconsensus.org/wp-content/uploads/2018/11/Power-Fire-Culvert-Project.pdf); wants support for it; Rich and Jan want be involved. 		
	 Working on NFWF project; still have some funds, working on several types of projects; working with our members to vet ideas. Talk to Rick if you have projects in need of funding; money should be distributed in January. There may be grant opportunities. A planning grant went to the ACCG meadow team and some money went to a Plumas County project (Foster Meadows). Project mitigation enhancement money might be available – ask Katherine Evatt for details; CalTrans is working on culverts in Amador and Alpine – coordinate? 		
	Would like a support letter from ACCG. Run through Planning WG. Complete form (Jill sent this).		
9	 Monitoring Work Group update (Wall, Starrett) Volunteer Opportunities: October 28th and November 4th: Help plant willows in Upper Onion Valley Meadow. RSVP to Gwen Starrett: gstarrett@volcano.net Next Monitoring WG meeting scheduled for 11/14 – same day as General Meeting. Will provide more info soon. 		
10	 Agency/organization updates (round table) Katherine Evatt, Foothill Conservancy: Rolling out habitat study; LINK; Bluegrass concert on 11/16. Scott Tangenberg, USFS, Calaveras RD: Oversnow vehicle process; comment period ended last week; evaluating, producing a final EIS with intention of signing ROD in February. Landscape level planning: on cusp of initiating analysis; will encompass entire forest, entire Sierra National Forest; will involve close coordination with ACCG and other collaboratives. Kickoff within next few months. Lots of engagement opportunities. Jan Bray, CalAm Team and Amador Fire Safe Council: submitted 3 grant applications to SNC: Antelope, Tiger Creek, and Mokulumne Watershed; will also submit to CCI CalFire; Butte Fire reforestation being considered; will bring to ACCG for support. Run through planning WG? Winton Road hazard trees? Ray says not happening; will ask and get back to Jan. If it is a county road, then becomes FS responsibility. If county, use FEMA grant? Joe Aragon, USFS, Calaveras RD: many projects; Black Springs has accelerated; Donnel Fire recovery is top priority; getting Black Springs laid out. May be shifted toward Donnell recovery; Arnold-Avery decision memo signed; Joe to send summary to Tony and Rick. New fuels categorical exemption to do strategic plan for future; projects in Calaveras: Arnold-Avery; Black Springs, Cabbage Patch (went through Planning WG via Hemlock project). NOTE: a member noted that the Arnold-Avery project may be using CFLRA funds without ACCG's engagement/agreement – put on November agenda, 20-30 minutes. Rich Farrington, UMWRA/AWA: applied for 3rd SNC grant; concerned about future projects; would like 		
	5-year project list; goal 3 of strategic plan is of interest. Wants dialog for 5-year project list. Reorganizing staff; increasing capacity; will have dedicated administration officer and new Executive Officer; starting in January; concerned about losing CFLRA dollars; state is increasing funds; deadlines come up so quickly. UMWRA budgeted for staff work to develop a list; can't do it in a vacuum; need		

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	to coordinate with ACCG; interested in culvert projects; local contractors preferred: works under procurement guidelines of EMBMUD, not state, so can write in local preference. Have done more outreach to local contractors; contractors' workshop in June. Strategic plan calls this out. Maybe do a presentation to group on UMWRA projects.
	 Frank Axe, Amador BOS: Had many complaints about the recent power outage; communications were not great.
	• Ray Cablayan, USFS, Calaveras RD: Just started prescribed burn south of Salt Springs; will be burning next few days; ~100 acres; Cabbage Patch interested in Master Stewardship Agreement with Calaveras County. Timber sale: also Black Springs this FY to add to FY19 accomplishments. Prather Medusa area; Member suggestion: include ACCG and local contractors. Maybe work with nongovernment agencies so not bound by government contracting-procurement requirements; will those projects be vetted through ACCG? Calaveras Master Stewardship Agreement: met with county team; looking at Tuolumne county MSA
	as an example; wanted to know projects; fuel breaks, dozer lines; etc. Agreement language should be inclusive of a broad range of forest work flexible. Vehicle to add capacity, non-federal grant applicants.
	 Rick Hopson, USFS Amador Ranger District: Implementation: Scottiago Hazard Trees: working on contract; decision finalized; next week field trip will deal with marking; thanks for letter from ACCG; scoping closed last week; public meeting; had many private land owners show up. Still working on size of commercial trees; will come back pre-decision to this group. Timber sales: Copy Cat, Callie Cat, Foster Firs; Panther timber sale; being advertised now.
	Amador Ranger District got letter of appreciation from Amador Board of Supervisors. Cool! • Don Hintenmiller, ABC: Having 1st meeting today at 3PM; Kendall Young involved; Wild Turkey
	Association; many pieces; Cal Trans; CalFIRE, all welcome to listen in.
	 David Griffith, ABC: Good neighbor authority for Region 4, Forest Service, now being signed. No money yet; ABC grant app with EDA economic developement authority on how to deal with excess biomass and benefit local economy. On hold; ABC yesterday had a show and tell to Board of Supervisors with CHIPS; went well; made a impression.
	 Gerald Schwartz, EBMUD: Tour for legislators and staff of upcountry facilities of EBMUD; W&S, wastewater, etc. Nov 19th.
	 Trish Frazier, Mother Lode Job Training: Has grants available to help organizations with natural resources projects. Provides part-time workers for projects to train workers or can subsidize skilled full-time workers for 6-9 months; can also come in to train current employees. Has had little response.
