

Why collaborate?

Stakeholders jointly achieve a level/form of collaboration almost none of them thought possible, and which is essential for meeting the group's objectives.

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
Collaboration is rooted in a very practical motivation: to increase a group's capacity to meet its objectives and individual parties to advance their own objectives in the process.






When is collaboration *strategic*?






1. Strategic Collaboration *supports shared or complementary purpose(s)*

- Coordinate between and among land managers, stewardship groups, private industry and other stakeholders
- Identify management actions & projects with multiple benefits (i.e., triple bottom line)
- Maximize scale of impact (across ownership/management boundaries/jurisdictions)
- Attract funding opportunities
- Measure & manage forest health together



2. Strategic Collaboration maximizes potential value

- Advances individual interests
- Advances shared and/or complementary goals
- Creates efficiency for stakeholders
- Achieves collective impact
- Leverages existing resources and attracts new resources





Individuals / organizations able to realize mutual gain

MUTUAL GAINS APPROACH TO NEGOTIATION

PREPARE

Clarify your mandate and define your team

Estimate Best Alternative to Negotiated Agreements (BATNA) yours and theirs

Know your own interests and think about their interests

Improve your BATNA (if possible)

Prepare to suggest mutually beneficial options

CREATE VALUE

Suspend criticism

Invent without committing

Generate options that exploit differences

Bundle options into multiple packages

DISTRIBUTE VALUE

Behave in ways that build trust

Identify standards/ criteria for dividing value that all sides can support

Keep at least two packages in play

Use neutrals to suggest possible distributions

FOLLOW THROUGH

Design nearly selfenforcing agreements


Specify mechanisms to deal with "predictable surprises"

Agree on monitoring arrangements, including metrics

Keep working to improve relationships

3. Strategic Collaboration supports *high likelihood* of *producing effective agreements, actions & outcomes*

Goal: widespread understanding and support



Key factors:

- Participation
- Structure
- Process
- Transparency
- Trust building



Participation tied to outcomes


- Participation balanced to achieve broader thinking & greater buy-in
- Roles, responsibilities & decision-making well defined
