Dear Interested Party,

You are receiving this letter to inform you of a Forest Service proposal to thin pre-commercial sized trees (less than 10 inches) in young plantations and natural stands within the 2004 Power Fire perimeter. The location for the project area is approximately 20 miles east of Pioneer, California, between Hwy 88 and the Mokelumne River.

My preliminary assessment is that the activities in this project fall within the following category of actions listed in the Forest Service National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Handbook, FSH 1909.15, section 32:

• Timber stand and/or wildlife habitat improvement activities that do not include the use of herbicides or require more than 1 mile of low standard road construction. (36 CFR 220.6 (e)(6))

Projects within these categories are excluded from documentation in an Environmental Assessment (EA) or Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). Our preliminary evaluation of anticipated environmental effects indicate there are no extraordinary circumstances [FSH 1909.15-31.2)] that would require preparation of an EA or EIS for some of the proposed activities.
