Amador-Calaveras Consensus Group (ACCG) Monitoring Work Group and South Fork of the American River Cohesive Strategy (SOFAR) Landscape Design Team Post Fire Restoration Symposium

Symposium Goal: The ACCG Monitoring workgroup and the SOFAR Landscape Design Team is hosting a symposium that will highlight ongoing monitoring and research in the Power Fire and its application in post fire restoration planning (e.g. Caldor Fire). Monitoring strategies such as the one crafted for the ACCG are designed to accommodate the adaptive management process by choosing tractable questions, identifying indicators that measure a specific attribute over time that documents change in a specific condition, and by selecting a set of indicator target values or conditions and trigger points that would inform management action. This symposium would focus on how we could apply our monitoring and research across the ACCG and SOFAR to support post fire restoration planning and help to inform adaptive management. Some of the topics will include treatment effects on wildlife, variable density treatments in plantations, predicting plantation survival and growth, hardwood management, aquatics and meadow restoration. Discussions will provide the opportunity for collaboration on the implications of the work and how to apply this knowledge to future post fire management.
