ACCG Pyrosilviculture Shared Vision: continue discussions on defining broad plan for implementing pyrosilviculture shared vision. Proposed next steps from 2021 Pyrosilviculture Ad Hoc group discussion (Greg Suba, 10/21/2021):

- 1. Understand the landscape and subdivide it into strategically derived fire management areas (e.g., PODs, boxes, etc.)
- 2. Agree on strategy for where, when, and how best to manage for fire within every containment area / box, and between containment areas / boxes.
- 3. Identify which boxes are in most urgent need of work in order to apply, manage, and/or suppress fire effectively and as safely as possible.
- 4. Seek and obtain funding for that work.
- 5. Implement 1st-entry fire and/or thinning followed by fire as planned.
